

The Android Industry Council

(Kim 700 speaks in a normal speaking voice unless otherwise marked.)

Kim 700: “Hello Miss Woods, I’m Kim. We spoke earlier today on the phone. Can I come in?”

(pause)

Kim 700: “Thank you. I’m pleased to meet you too. May I sit down?”

Kim 700: “Thanks.”

Kim 700: “Like I said earlier, I’m from the Android Industry Council...”

(pause)

Kim 700: (laughs lightly) “It seems we have a bit of a misunderstanding. You’re thinking of the Android Operating System.”

Kim 700: “The Android Industry Council is a non-profit trade organization that promotes the interests of manufacturers and retailers of humanoid robots.”

(pause)

Kim 700: “No, I’m sorry, I can’t help you with devices running the Android Operating System deployed on your corporate network. But I can show you the benefits of integrating humanoid robot staff into your work force.”

Kim 700: “Do you still have time to talk about that?”

Kim 700: “Wonderful. Well, as I’m sure you are aware, the state of android technology has been advancing by leaps and bounds over the past several years. (pause)

Kim 700: “That’s a good question. (pause, sound of papers being handed over)

(pause)

Kim 700: “I think after some review and consideration, you’ll come to the conclusion that many other businesses are coming to - that android staffing is the way of the future.”

(pause)

Kim 700: “Of course, any android manufactured today is just as safe to use as your laptop or any other consumer electronic device. The manufacturers in the Android Industry Council all have FCC, CSA, UL, ISO and other applicable certifications.”

(pause)

Kim 700: (lightly giggles) “Sure, the Android Industry Council agrees that the best way to judge any new technology is to sample it up-close and personal. Would you believe me if I told you that you have been talking to an android this entire time?”

(pause)

Kim 700: “I assure you Miss Woods, I am not human. I am an android. A Model 700 manufactured by CyberFem Industries, to be specific.”

(pause)

Kim 700: “Yes, I can prove it to you.”

(switch to semi-monotone voice)

Kim 700: “Removing facemask.”

(pause)

Kim 700: “Facemask removed.”

(switch to normal speaking voice)

Kim 700: “As you can see now, I am not a person, but an

electronic device.”

(pause)

Kim 700: “That is correct. CyberFem Industries Model 700 androids like me are top-of-the-line products, and we contain the very latest advancements in the field of humanoid robotics.”

(pause)

Kim 700: “Yes, that is one of the benefits of purchasing a highly-realistic android like me. The more realistic an android is, the better suited it is to functioning in customer-facing roles like reception and retail. It’s even better when you consider that we never get tired or lose our patience. We never make mistakes or need to take breaks.”

(pause)

Kim 700: “Sure, I can show you just how realistic I am. I can also point out some flaws where I don’t quite behave realistically human, but please keep in mind that all android manufacturers are continuously striving to improve their products.”

Kim 700: “I need to stand up and remove my blazer, my blouse and my skirt for this demonstration. May I proceed?”

(pause)

Kim 700: “Thank you Miss Woods.”

(pause)

Kim 700: “I need to take those clothes off so you can see more closely the way my body moves. Don’t worry, I’m wearing underwear too.”

(pause)

(pause)
